


EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: UPDATE 2024

The contributions of higher education extend far beyond an individual degree. Private, nonprofit colleges and universities play significant roles in the everyday lives of those living and working in college communities and are important contributors to the nation as a whole. The report, Private, Nonprofit Higher Education: Shaping Lives and Anchoring Communities (http://www.naicu.edu/PrivateCollegeImpact), which has been partially updated to reflect data from the 2021-22 academic year, tells the story of the economic, social and cultural vitality that private, nonprofit colleges and universities add to communities, regions and the nation.

Serving as one of the nation's primary vehicles for social and economic mobility, private, nonprofit colleges and universities are accelerating economic growth, creating jobs and boosting the nation's tax base.

As part of a diverse array of large public land-grant and regional universities, community colleges and for-profit institutions, the 1,700 private, nonprofit colleges and universities account for over 40% of all degree-granting institutions and educate more than 5 million students.


